

Singer/songwriter Bobby Caldwell to Perform Soul, Pop, R&B and Standards at Annenberg Theater



October 28, 2008 (Palm Springs, CA) – Soulful singer/songwriter Bobby Caldwell will grace the stage of the Annenberg Theater on November 22, 2008 at 8 p.m. Featuring electrifying live performances, he draws on a vast repertoire of R&B, intimate smooth jazz stylings, and big band songs to wow his crowds at worldwide venues. Caldwell appeals to a diverse audience as he performs his urban adult contemporary and classic hits.

One of the most revered vocalists and songwriters in contemporary music today, Caldwell has earned many accolades as a singer with numerous solo releases. He has also written many hits for artists such as Chicago, Boz Scaggs, Peter Cetera and Amy Grant, Neil Diamond and Al Jarreau. His timeless 1978 classic, *What You Won't Do For Love* has been recorded by more than 100 artists.

About Bobby Caldwell

Caldwell is wildly popular in Japan and throughout Asia, where he often sells out shows and achieves gold and platinum status for his releases. In addition to heavy touring, Caldwell starred as Frank Sinatra in the David Cassidy/Don Reo theatrical production *The Rat Pack Is Back in Las Vegas, Nevada*. Caldwell has been featured on *The CBS Second Cup Café*, *The Tonight Show starring Jay Leno*, *BET Jazz Central*, and has made numerous national and local network appearances.

A sample of Bobby's song *Open Your Eyes* appeared in the Grammy nominated platinum rap hit *The Light* by Common. All combined, Bobby's songs and samples have contributed to over 40 million sales, while artists as diverse as Tupac Shakur, Michael Bolton, Roberta Flack, Go West, Vanessa Williams and Notorious B.I.G. have all paid tribute. Caldwell's classic song was sung by Elliot Yamin during the final 3 round of American Idol 2006.

Located downtown in an architecturally-significant E. Stewart Williams-designed building, the Palm Springs Art Museum features exciting exhibitions of contemporary, Native American, Western and Pre-Columbian art in spacious galleries. It features two sculpture gardens, stimulating lectures and educational programs for all ages, and offers diverse performances at its Annenberg Theater.
