

Four Freshmen to Appear at Annenberg Theater

November 12, 2009 (Palm Springs, CA) – The Annenberg Theater at the Palm Springs Art Museum will present the Four Freshman in a special holiday concert on November 29, 2008 at 8 p.m. Featuring unmistakable vocal harmonies, the Four Freshmen will perform some of their classic hits mixed with holiday favorites in this one night only performance.

This concert features holiday favorites such as *Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas*, *Walking in a Winter Wonderland*, *The Christmas Song* and *Let it Snow*. Additionally the group will perform Four Freshmen standards including *September Song*, *Something's Gotta Give*, *Skylark* and *My One and Only Love*.

About the Four Freshmen

Now in their 60th year, the Four Freshmen are the longest lasting vocal harmony group. In 1948, the original Four Freshmen pioneered a new style of close-harmony vocals building on the barbershop tradition and were most well known for their hits *Blue World*, *Graduation Day* and *Poinciana*. Over the years, the members of the group have changed, but the same fluid style of music remains the same. They have produced more than 45 albums and have had 70 top selling singles with 6 Grammy nominations. The performers often accompanying themselves on guitar, trumpet, trombone, bass, and drums, and their repertoire consists primarily of jazz and popular standards. The current members of the group are Brian Eichenberger, Curtis Calderon, Vince Johnson and Bob Ferreira.

Located downtown in an architecturally-significant E. Stewart Williams-designed building, the Palm Springs Art Museum features exciting exhibitions of contemporary, Native American, Western and Pre-Columbian art in spacious galleries. It features two sculpture gardens, stimulating lectures and educational programs for all ages, and offers diverse performances at its Annenberg Theater. The Art Museum is open six days a week; Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Thursday from 12 p.m. to 8 p.m. Admission is free to members; \$12.50 for adults; \$10.50 for seniors 62 and over; \$5 for adult students and active-duty military with I.D. and free for youths 17 and under.
